Bromley Council services

You may be interested to know that an Orpington resident has been prosecuted for dumping building materials within the wooded part of Warren Road. The offender was ordered to pay fines and costs totalling £340. Councillor Colin Smith. Executive Councillor for Environment said "It is always regrettable having to resort to prosecution to reinforce this message, but the council simply will not tolerate such anti-social behaviour, and our thanks go to this witness for coming forward. I would urge residents to report dumped rubbish to us, particularly if they witness the offence being committed. Fly-tipping is illegal, spoils the environment and removed at great expense to the taxpayer. Every fly-tipping incident is investigated and we will continue to prosecute when we have sufficient evidence."

The witness who helped secure this conviction was awarded £500 for helping bring the case to a successful conclusion. The witness has generously donated the award to Friends of Warren Road Greenspace, for which we are extremely grateful.

Fenced off areas in Warren Road

A couple of residents have asked why certain areas in the woodland in the centre of Warren are fenced off?

Within the last 18 months Bromley Council planted 'whips' (small trees) to replace the old trees that had been removed. The whips will eventually grow maintaining the wooded area. The protective fencing around the new trees will be removed when the trees are growing strongly, but this may not be for some time.
